RPAC is the only political organization devoted to protecting REALTOR® interests.

Contributions to RPAC are not deductible for federal income tax purposes. Contributions are voluntary and are used for political purposes. The amounts indicated are merely guidelines and you may contribute more or less than the suggested amounts. The National Association of REALTORS® and its state and local associations will not favor or disadvantage any member because of the amount contributed or a decision not to contribute. You may refuse to contribute without reprisal. Your contribution is split between National RPAC and the State PAC in your state. Contact your State Association or PAC for information about the percentages of your contribution provided to National RPAC and to the State PAC. The National RPAC portion is used to support federal candidates and is charged against your limits under 52 U.S.C. 30116.

Some people misunderstand what RPAC is and what it does. The Pennsylvania Realtors® Political Action Committee is a critical part of Realtor® advocacy efforts. Check out the facts on why RPAC is critical for your business and the clients you represent.

MYTH

RPAC only supports candidates who are "from that other party."

FACT

RPAC is a bipartisan organization that evaluates candidates based on their positions on real estate and housing-related issues and not their party affiliation.

MYTH

RPAC buys votes and it's part of the problem.

FACT

RPAC does NOT buy votes and elections. End of story. RPAC gives us an opportunity to support candidates who support Realtor® positions on important housing and real estate issues and to develop relationships with these officials who make important policy positions.

MYTH

I can't control where my RPAC investment goes.

FACT

RPAC is a member-driven organization that works closely with local Realtor® associations. An extremely detailed process governs how and when RPAC gets involved in elections and which candidates are supported and local associations and their members play a key role in that process.
